ASAM POST SECONDARY SCHOLARSHIP

The American Saddlebred Association of Maine (ASAM) supports the educational aspirations of previous youth members by providing a yearly \$ 500.00 scholarship to an outstanding young man or woman who will be, or is currently, enrolled in a post secondary educational program. The applicant must be a Maine resident who is currently a member in good standing with ASAM and who has previously been or is a youth member for a full annual year.

This scholarship will be awarded annually to a high school senior or college student who plans to continue or is continuing his/her education in college, technical or trade school, or an apprenticeship.

NOTE: It does not have to be an equine-related career! The scholarship will be paid directly to the applicant after receiving a written request, along with proof of acceptance to a post secondary program and evidence of completion of their first semester (or equivalent period of training). Scholarship must be paid to student within two years after it is awarded.

Selection will be based on applicant's ability and aptitude for serious study, along with community service, leadership, and achievements. This is not be a need-based award, therefore applicants should not disclose personal financial information. Previous winners are ineligible to participate a second time, but applicants who did not win are definitely encouraged to reapply! Applicants may have also applied for MHA or other horse association scholarships.
